### Professional Function of NOTS Public Health Branch Outlined

One of the least publicized, yet most vital services contributing to the welfare of Station residents is the Public Health Branch consisting of public health nurses Doris Whitley and Edith Hurst.

The Public Health Branch was established in 1946 when the Station population had risen to 6,000 civilian and military personnel. One year later, Doris Whitley became the one-member staff to be joined five years later by Edith Hurst.

While the Branch is administratively located under the Department of Community Affairs, it receives its professional supervision from the Station Medical Officer and the office is located in the Station Dispensary.

### Driver's Exam Schedule

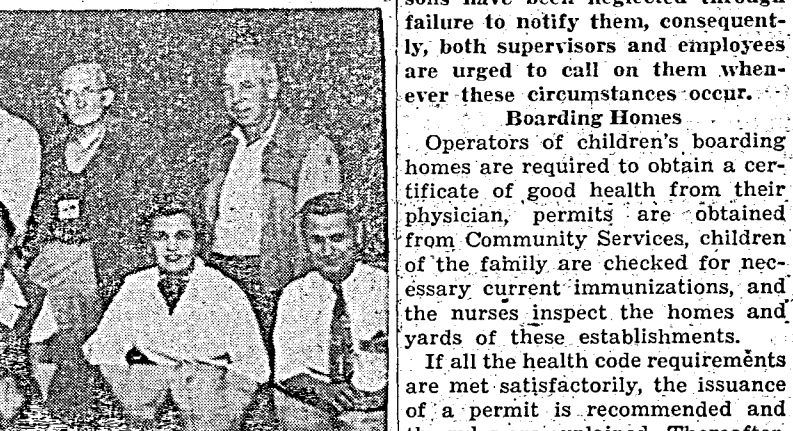
Station residents are reminded that government driver's exams are given daily at NOTS, China Lake.
