Children new to the district who have not yet registered must register at the Burroughs School office before assignment to school and class can be made.

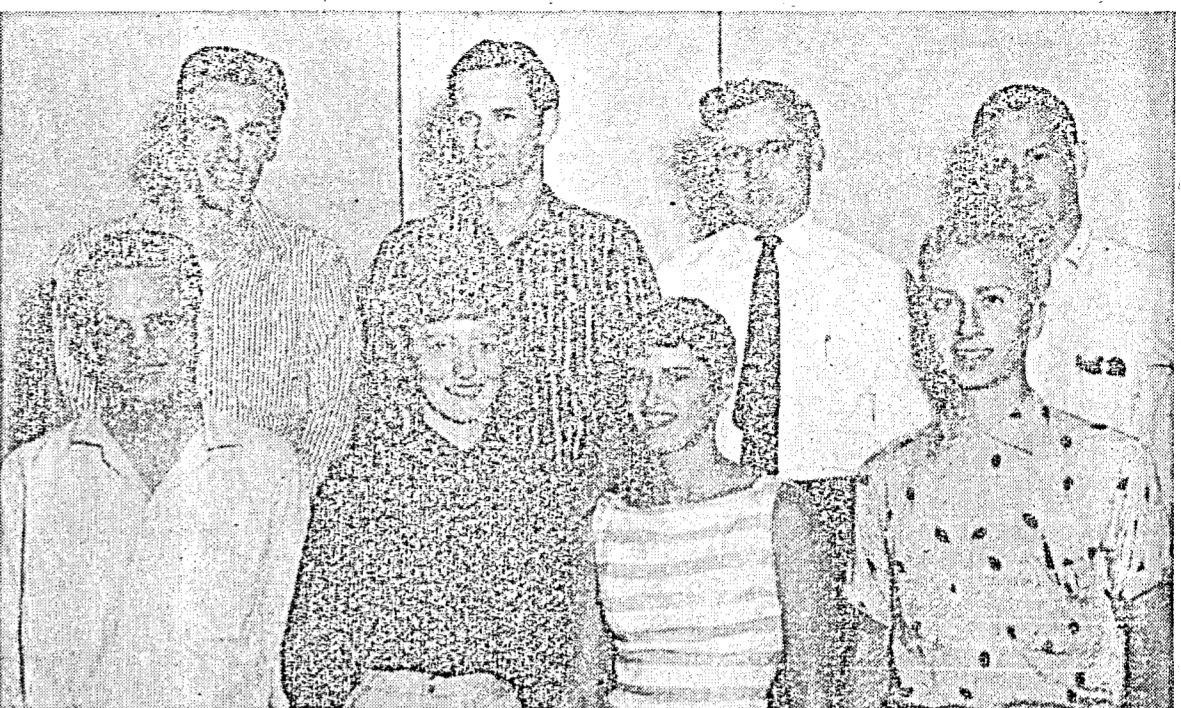
First Grade Zones Richmond School first grade zone takes in the housing area north of Halsey and Bowen Avenues...

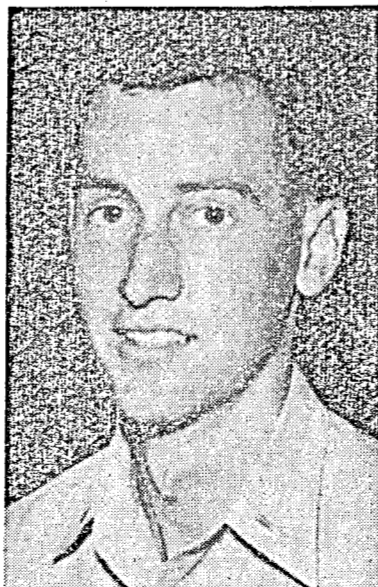
