

he will go in the fourth step of the new GS-5. Q. What if he is in a longevity step?

A. The longevity steps, which follow the regular seven steps in most grades, may be numbered 8, 9, and 10 for convenience. In these grades, a person in the first longevity step would go to step 8, a person in the second would go to step 9, etc.

Q. Does the pay reform bill continue to provide longevity rates?

A. Yes, in effect, although they are not so named. Instead of 7 step rates to the top of the grade in GS-1 through GS-10 and then 3 longevity steps, for example, the proposal is to have 10 regular step rates. This would eliminate the requirement for 10 years in grade in order to be entitled to the first longevity step, a provision that causes inequities to employees who, on promotion, enter a grade at an intermediate step.

Q. How about employees in grades GS-11 to 15 - grades that had fewer than the 10 steps

A. Take GS-11 as an example. This is a grade that has 6 regular steps and 3 longevity steps. In this case you would number the longevity steps 7, 8, and 9 for purposes of
