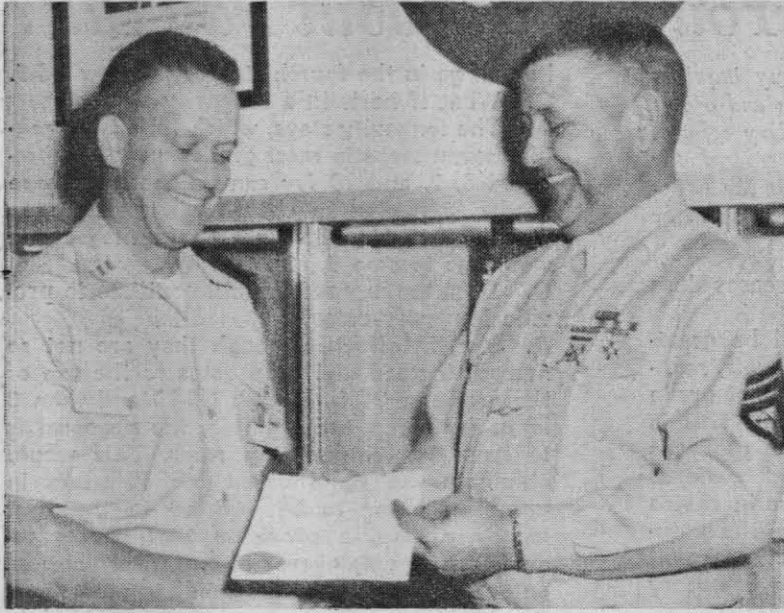
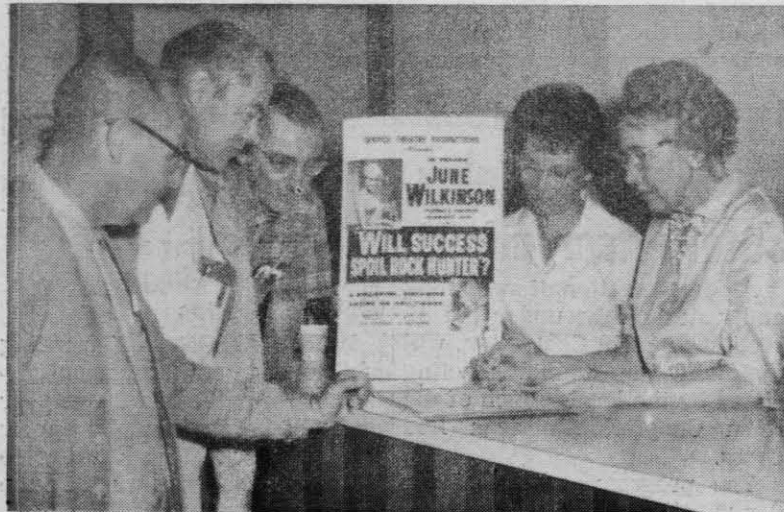

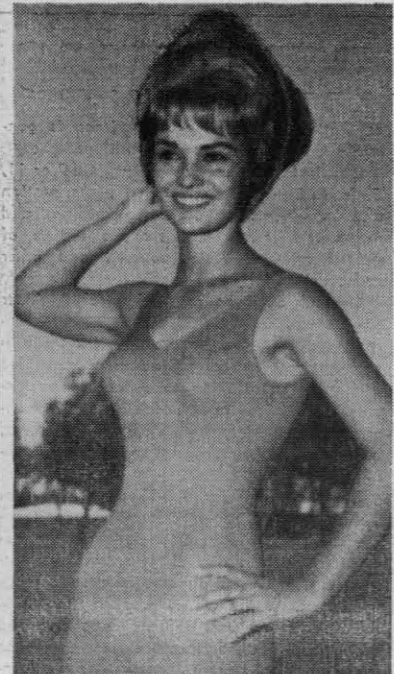
ication ceremonies of Burroughs high school.

Biting 'Bandit' Dog On Loose; Victim Is Seeking Outlaw

A station-wide search has been launched to locate a stray dog that last Monday morning bit Navy officer Lieutenant (jg) William E. Lockie on the hand. Authorities say Lockie must undergo a series of painful anti-rabies shots if the dog is not located within 14 days.

Described as an all-white animal, possibly having off-white markings, it had short hair and stood about 15 inches high, Lockie said. He said he was chasing the dog from his back yard at 301-A Nimitz at about 5:00 a.m. last Monday when it attacked him.

PAL Air Schedules Revised; Service To Start Here May 8

Pacific Air Lines' scheduled flights between Inyokern and Los Angeles, due to begin service Apr. 24, but delayed because of a Civil Aeronautics Board ruling, will go into service Tuesday, May 8, according

to an announcement made today by a PAL official.
Last minute negotiations with the CAB could delay inauguration of the new service until May 10, he said, but the chances of another delay are remote.

Avalon passenger service, for years the only commercial line servicing this area, will terminate its flights with the inauguration of PAL service.

Officials emphasized the necessity for having Navy TRs or tickets for NOTS passengers flying on orders.

'No Show' Ruling Effective May 1

Effective May 1, you can either shell out from \$5 to \$40 as a penalty for neglecting to keep an airline reservation, or, if denied a seat after making a reservation because of overloaded condition, collect that amount of money.

The nation's major airlines put into effect the new ruling as a six-month trial. After that period of time, the 11 airlines involved will decide whether it should be continued or dropped.
